

Commodities of concern for export to Russia and Belarus

The US authorities remain concerned about exports that support the development of maritime technology, microelectronics, and other technologies that can be used to support Russia's military and defense sector.

Based upon historical information and current developments, BIS (the US authority for export control) has identified the following commodities as presenting special concern because of their potential diversion to and end use by Russia and Belarus to further their military and defense capabilities: This is not a complete listing of commodities sought by or prohibited for end-users in Russia and Belarus, but this list of commodities that present special concern can assist in the risk-based screening of export-related financial transactions.
